# **Position Overview**

As Director of Government Affairs, you will lead RENEW's public policy development and advocacy efforts in the State of Wisconsin. In coordination with the Board of Directors and Executive Director, you will be responsible for developing policy goals and the strategies to achieve them. You will be the lead person for communication and engagement with public officials and key stakeholders. Your primary focus will be on state-level policies developed by legislators and administration officials. However, you will also occasionally engage with federal and local legislative bodies and government agencies as needed.

## **Responsibilities**

- Closely monitor and report on developing legislative or administrative policies or initiatives.
- Develop strong relationships with state, federal, and local government officials, state agencies, and relevant legislative and agency staff
- Build strong relationships with industry leaders, community leaders, and other stakeholders.
- Build industry coalitions in support of policy priorities.
- Directly lobby public officials and staff to support pro-renewable energy policies.
- Provide expert testimony to legislative committees.
- Attend and present information at public meetings and events.
- Communicate with the media on renewable energy policy and news.
- Coordinate renewable energy-related project tours with public officials and stakeholders.
- Manage all political fundraising, reporting, and related activities.
- Prepare and submit all required lobbying reports.
- Prepare regular reports and briefings for the Board of Directors and members.

- Extensive policy development and advocacy experience in Wisconsin.
- Lobbying or relevant experience (e.g., state legislative or executive branch staff member).
- Ability to build strong relationships and work closely with leaders and key members of both parties of the legislature, the administration, and other government leaders.
- Able to build relationships with various trade associations, not-for-profit organizations, and other stakeholders in the state.
- Experience with energy industry issues (utility, trade org, ISO, agency, etc.).
- Working knowledge of clean, renewable energy technologies and transmission
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, comfortable in public speaking roles.
- Ability to work both independently and within a team context.
- Willingness to travel for events and meetings.
